The Dutch National Committee of the IPS has the pleasure to invite all IPS members and other interested persons to the IPS 50 Year's Jubilee Symposium "Peatlands: past, present and future" (working title) in 2018. The venue will be in **Rotterdam** and the dates are set now to **11** - **13 September 2018**. Please mark your calendars already now! The preliminary programme includes keynote speeches and parallel sessions as well as an icebreaking party on Tuesday, lectures on 4-6 sites on Wednesday (focusing on landscape history, soils subsidence, CO₂ emissions and water control) plus a gala party on the same evening, followed by visits to high tech horticulture and peat application sites on Thursday. Discussions will deal with social, economic and environmental aspects of peat and peatlands, including worldwide peat demand forecasts, with special focus on Asia. The event will be closed by a panel discussion. Also additional excursions are possible, e.g. to flower auctions, potting soil companies or machinery and other suppliers. Peatlands for Birds in Sheffield in September

A conference on "Peatlands for Birds - Issues & Opportunities in Re-constructing Peat Landscapes in uplands & Iowlands" will be held during **6** - **8 September 2017** in Sheffield, UK. The meeting will address key issues of how Britain's peatlands could or should be managed and restored so that they provide a future resilient and sustainable habitat at landscape level. This will be a major national conference with relevance to wider international issues as well that will bring together landowners, managers, practitioners and key academics to examine the ecological and conservation issues for the restoration of upland and lowland peatlands specifically, for birds. The first day (6th September) starts late-morning with presentations followed by a field visit in the afternoon/early evening. The following two days will be a mixture of plenary and parallel sessions with poster presentations and displays. On the evening of the 7th September, participants will be able to book for a trip along the Tinsley Canal to see an alternative side to Sheffield and some of the birdlife that flourishes there. Speakers include: Professor Des Thompson, John Calladine, Andreas Heinemeyer, Richard Lindsay, Pat Thompson, Ian Rotherham, and Mark Eddowes plus representatives from BASC, Natural England, the Heather Trust, Lakenheath Fen and others. Biodiversity: Experiences and Best Practices for Protected Areas

The Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) invites parties and other experts to undertake a review of experiences on:

- Protected areas and other effective area-based conservation measures, taking into account the work of the International Union for Conservation of Nature and other appropriate expert bodies;
- Additional measures to enhance integration of protected areas and other effective area-based conservation measures into the wider land- and seascapes;
- Mainstreaming of protected areas and other effective area-based conservation measures across sectors to contribute, inter alia, to the Sustainable Development Goals and as natural solutions to combat climate change; and
- Effective governance models for management of protected areas, including equity, taking into account work being undertaken under Articles 8(j).

Aim is to develop voluntary guidance on the elements listed above. Please provide the CBD Secretariat with information related to your experiences, as well as best practices and lessons learned on the above items no later than **30 August 2017** to secretariat (at) cbd.int.
